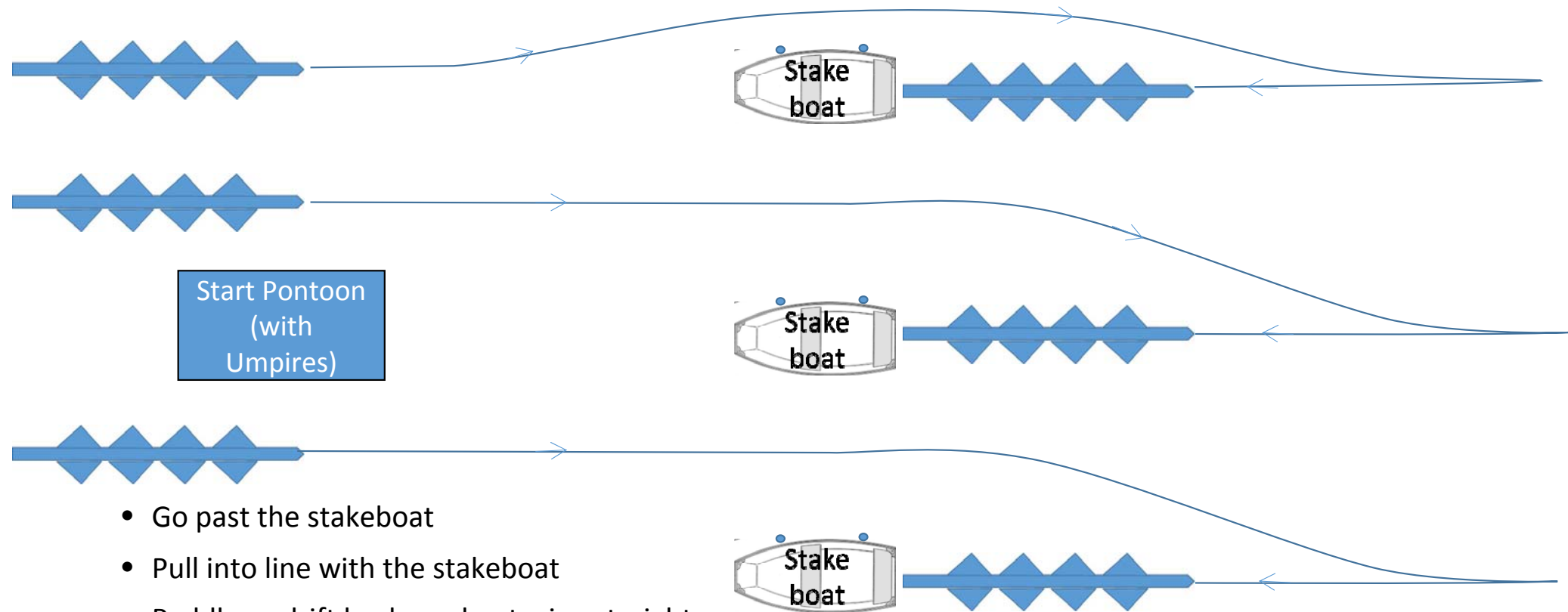

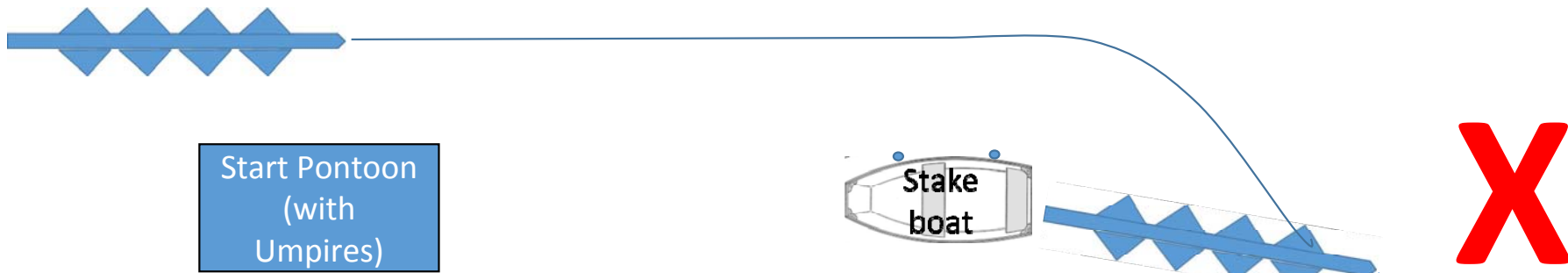
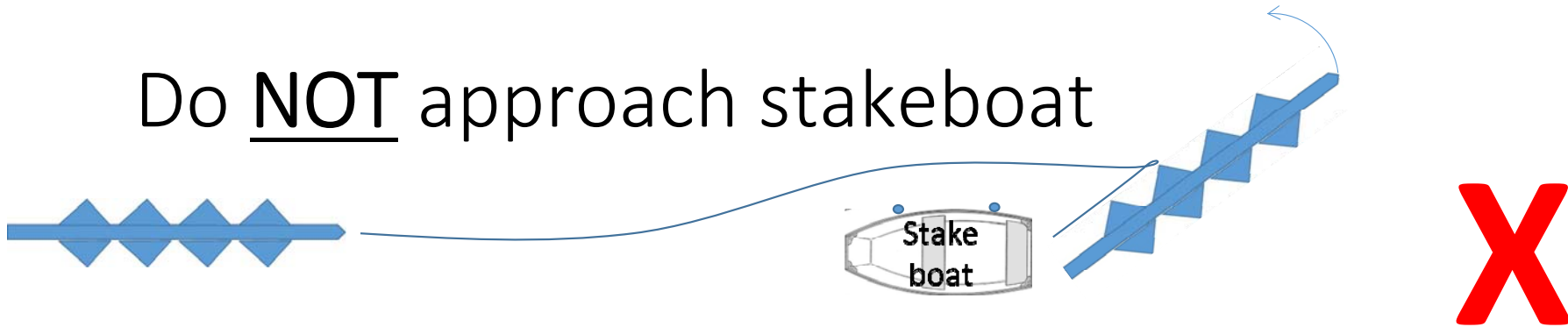

Approach stakeboat

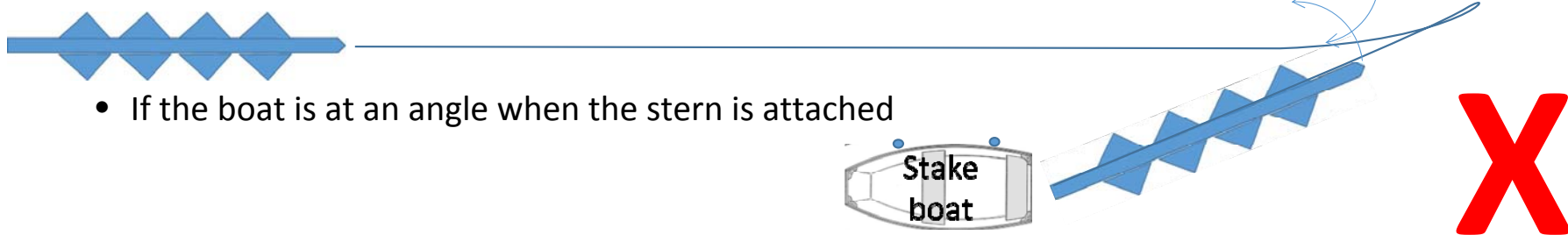


- Go past the stakeboat
- Pull into line with the stakeboat
- Paddle or drift backwards, staying straight
- As soon as the stern is attached, the boat will start to swing, so stay alert. Especially cox and bow pair.

Do NOT approach stakeboat



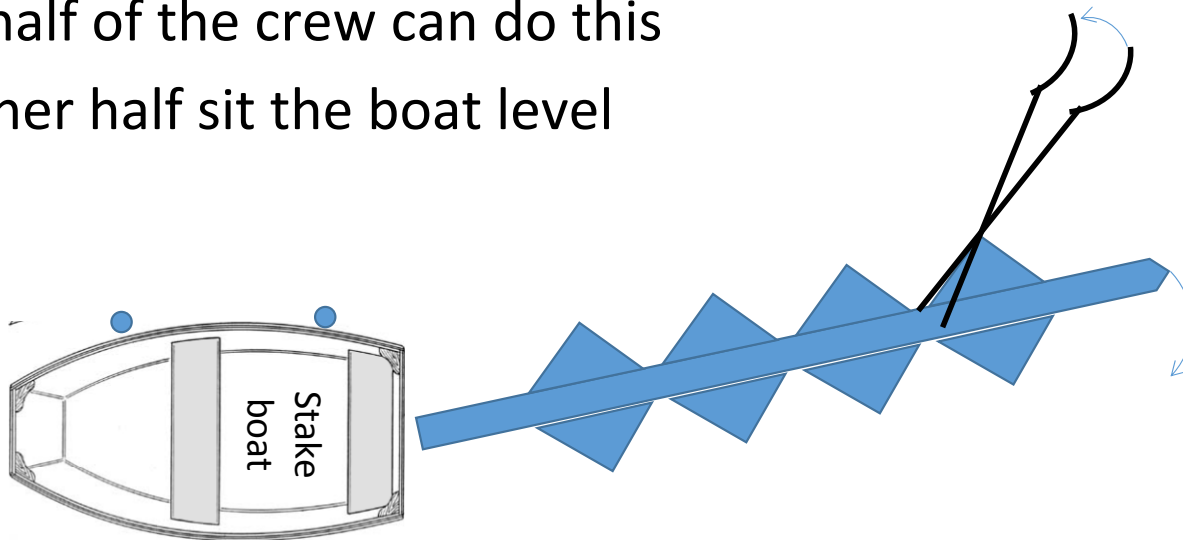
Start Pontoon

- If the boat is at an angle when the stern is attached
- The stream and the wind will turn the boat more quickly than you can straighten it

Paddling at frontstops – arms only

- Bow comes to frontstops
- With his/her right hand only, paddles, using only his/her arms
- Up to half of the crew can do this
- The other half sit the boat level



Scratching the boat

- Bow passes his/her blade handle to 2
- 2 paddles using his/her arms only, with the blade parallel to the boat
- This is very effective
- Up to half of the crew can do this
- The other half sit the boat level
